# Questions & Answers

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**Question: 1**

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A messaging system employs hashes that accompany each message. What function can hashing perform in this context?

- A. Guarantee the confidentiality of a message.
- B. Verify the origination of a message.
- C. Verify the integrity of a message.
- D. Verify the integrity and origination of a message.

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**Answer: D**

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**Explanation:**

Hashing is a cryptographic function that can be used to verify the integrity and origination of a message when used as a part of a digital signature. Hashing does not provide confidentiality—encryption would be required instead.

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**Question: 2**

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A gaming software startup company does not employ penetration testing of its software. This is an example of:

- A. Outsourcing
- B. Noncompliance
- C. High tolerance of risk
- D. Irresponsibility

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**Answer: C**

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**Explanation:**

A software startup in an industry like gaming is going to be highly tolerant of risk: time to market and signing up new customers will be its primary objectives. As the organization achieves viability, other priorities such as security will be introduced.

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**Question: 3**

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An organization is migrating its servers from physical to virtual. What privacy risks does the organization need to be concerned about concerning this migration?

- A. Security hardening of the container layer
- B. Eavesdropping of sensitive network traffic
- C. Guest OS privilege escalation
- D. Security hardening of the hypervisor layer

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**Answer: D**

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**Explanation:**

The primary concern in a physical-to-virtual migration is the security of the hypervisor. If the hypervisor is not hardened, it could be compromised, which could lead to the compromise of guest OSs. Security concerns will be exactly the same for operating systems that are copied into the virtualization environment.

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**Question: 4**

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An organization wants to fast-track the developm

- A. Audit logs will need to be scrubbed of PII.
- B. Personal information will need to be encrypted in storage.
- C. Rework will be necessary to comply with privacy laws.
- D. Users will have to be re-registered.

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**Answer: C**

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**Explanation:**

When the requirements phase of a project is skipped because of a “fast track” mandate, there is a high likelihood that considerable rework will be required to bring the product or service into compliance with privacy requirements (and applicable laws), security requirements, technical standards, and functional requirements. From a privacy perspective, it will be necessary to assess every aspect of the system, as well as supporting processes, to identify compliance gaps. The rework would be expensive.

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**Question: 5**

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What is usually the primary objective of risk management?

- A. Improved compliance
- B. Fewer and less severe privacy and security incidents
- C. Fewer audit findings
- D. No privacy or security incidents

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**Answer: B**

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**Explanation:**

The most common objective of a risk management program is to reduce the number and severity of privacy and security incidents.

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
